

YELLOW SCHOOL BUS TRANSPORTATION:

Students are eligible for transportation if they attend their home School **and** their residence is greater than 2.5 kilometres away. Students are also eligible for transportation if they attend a school other

than their home school, for a Board-approved program, and their residence is greater than 2.5 kilometres away. Detailed information is available at www.nsts.ca. Bus information for students will be available on August 21, 2017 by logging into the secure parent portal at www.nsts.ca, then enter your child's OEN number which can be found on their report card. Information will **NOT** be mailed home.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Where should I go?

St. Catharines Collegiate 34 Catherine Street, St. Catharines Foyer - enter through main doors

When should I register?

It is essential that students register on the grade specific, scheduled date. This will help to avoid long waits to register and to see a Guidance Counsellor.

What should I bring?

- Student Verification Form (Please review information, make any corrections, sign)
- Please review and sign the following:
 - Consent for Technology Programs
 - Consent for Science Programs
 - Digital Citizen Agreement
 - Permission to Participate in Physical Education Classes
 - Anaphylaxis (if applicable)
 - School Council Candidate Form (if interested)

All forms are required and must be completed and signed before timetables can be distributed.

Are there any costs to register?

There are no fees or costs charged to students to participate in the regular day school program. Secondary Students enrolled with the District School Board of Niagara are provided with the basic classroom learning resources that are required in order to complete the course expectations. Fees may be charged where the student chooses to upgrade the material or where purchase of materials is optional (ie: construction upgrade in the type of wood used, some visual arts materials, etc.)

Payment Methods:

All fees can be paid using School Cash Online (preferred method of payment) beginning August 1, 2017. School Cash Online can be accessed by visiting our website at www.collegiate.ca. A receipt can be printed from there and the school will have a record of payment. Alternatively, Cash or Debit will be accepted during registration days.

Student Activity Fee: \$35.00

Helps to offset the cost of student events and extra-curricular activities. (non-refundable after 60 days of attendance)

Graduation Fee: \$30.00

For all graduating students. Covers the cost of the cap and gown rental.

Yearbooks: \$40.00

Orders for yearbooks can be taken at registration or throughout the school year for those interested.

Locks: \$6.00

Locks can be purchased from registration or students can provide their own combination lock. Lockers are assigned on the first day of school by the homeroom teacher. Any students that do not have a period 1 class can come to the main office to be assigned one. Each student must have their own locker. Please note that key locks and sharing lockers is NOT permitted. Please note that the first day of class is Tuesday, September 5, 2017. This is a regular school day beginning at 8:10 am. We will be hosting a welcome breakfast for all Grade 9 students which will take place in the cafeteria from 7:45 to 8:10 am. Grade 9 students will meet their Period 1 teacher in the cafeteria and then proceed to class.
