

YELLOW SCHOOL BUS TRANSPORTATION:

Students are eligible for transportation if they attend their home School **and** their residence is greater than 2.5 kilometres away. Students are also eligible for transportation if they attend a school other

than their home school, for a Board-approved program, and their residence is greater than 2.5 kilometres away. Detailed information is available at www.nsts.ca. Bus information for students will be available on August 17, 2016 by logging into the secure parent portal at www.nsts.ca, then enter your child's OEN number which can be found on their report card. Information will **NOT** be mailed home.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Where should I go?

It is essential that students register on the grade specific, scheduled date. This will help to avoid long waits to register and to see a Guidance Counsellor.

What should I bring?

- Student Verification Form (Please review information, make any corrections and sign)
- Please review and sign the following:
 - Consent for Technology Programs
 - Consent for Science Programs
 - Digital Citizen Agreement
 - Permission to Participate in Physical Education Classes
 - Anaphylaxis (if applicable)
 - School Council Candidate Form (if interested)

All forms are required and must be completed and signed before timetables can be distributed.

Are there any costs to register?

There will be no fees or costs charged to students to participate in the regular day school program. Students enrolled in secondary schools in the District School Board of Niagara can expect to be provided with the basic classroom learning resources that are required in order to complete the course expectations. Fees may be charged where the student chooses to upgrade the material or where purchase of materials is optional (ie: construction upgrade in the type of wood used, some visual arts materials, etc.)

Student Activity Fee: \$35.00

This fee helps to offset the cost of student events and extra-curricular activities. (non-refundable after 60 days of attendance)

Graduation Fee: \$30.00

For all graduating students. This fee covers the cost of the cap and gown rental.

Yearbooks: \$35.00

Orders for yearbooks can be taken at registration for those interested.

Locks: \$6.00

Locks can be purchased from registration or students can provide their own combination lock. Each student must have their own locker (no sharing). Lockers are assigned on the first day of school by the homeroom teacher.

FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL:

Please note that the first day of class is Tuesday, September 6, 2016. This is a regular school day beginning at 8:10 am. We will be hosting a welcome breakfast for all Grade 9 students which will take place in the cafeteria from 7:45 to 8:10 am.
