



YELLOW SCHOOL BUS TRANSPORTATION:

Students are eligible for transportation if they attend their home School **and** their residence is greater than 2.5 kms away. Students are also eligible for transportation if they attend a school *other than* their home school, for a Board-approved program, and their residence is greater than 2.5 kms away. Detailed information is available at www.nsts.ca. Bus information for students will be available on August 20, 2018 by logging into the secure parent portal at www.nsts.ca, then enter your child's OEN number which can be found on their report card. Information is **NOT** mailed home.

It is essential that students register on the grade specific, scheduled date. This will help to avoid long waits to register and to see a Guidance Counsellor.

What must I bring?

 - Digital Citizen Agreement
 - Permission to Participate in Physical Education Classes
 - Anaphylaxis (if applicable)
 - School Council Candidate Form (if interested)

All forms are required and must be completed and signed before timetables can be distributed.

Are there any costs to register?

Secondary Students enrolled with the District School Board of Niagara are provided with the basic classroom learning resources that are required in order to complete the course expectations. Fees are not charged for the regular day school program. Additional fees may be charged where the student chooses to upgrade the material or where purchase of materials is optional (ie: construction upgrade in the type of wood used, some visual arts materials, etc.)

FEES DUE AT REGISTRATION:

Student Activity Fee: \$35.00

Helps to offset the cost of student events and extra-curricular activities. (non-refundable after 60 days of attendance)

Graduation Fee: \$30.00

For all graduating students. Covers the cost of the cap and gown rental.

Yearbooks: \$40.00 (optional)

Orders for yearbooks can be taken at registration or throughout the school year for those interested.

Locks: \$6.00 (optional)
