Collegiate enthusiastically participated in "Pink Day" on Wednesday, November 23rd.

The day was part of a campaign across the DSBN and Ontario to draw awareness to, and stamp out bullying. Collegiate takes bullying very seriously and we try our best to create a positive, safe, and welcoming environment for our students.

An indicators of this are the recent results of our school climate survey where 79% of Collegiate students reported that they felt a positive sense of belonging at Collegiate. The Canadian average for this survey was 69% of students felt that they had a positive sense of belonging at their respective schools.
